5 Year Highlights

Educating over 150 family members on how to plan for their child's future in a way that allows them to lead an integrated life.

Engaging 42 teens in work based learning experiences to promote employment readiness skills to assist them in entering the workforce following graduation.

Supporting 65 individuals to increase their personal independence in their home and community.

Facilitating community based recreational experiences for 79 teens and adults.

Being recognized for our inclusive best practices by the Missouri Governor's Council on Disability.

Expansion of our facilities as a result of the growth of our programs.

Assisting 30 adults in obtaining and maintaining employment in their community while being paid equitable wages.

Engagement in a hiring initiative that has resulted in the City of KC being only the second in the nation to adopt an ordinance that creates career pathways specifically for persons who have developmental disabilities.

# 2023 Highlights

## **Model Employer Initiative**

As part of our mission fulfillment efforts, Summit Future Foundation strives to increase employment opportunities for adults who have developmental disabilities by working with local businesses to improve their disability inclusion practices.

In the fall of 2022, we announced the City of Kansas City's commitment to a Model Employer initiative, which is a national framework that is used to help local- and state-level governments improve the recruitment, hiring, and retention of persons with disabilities. After a year of collaborative effort between Summit Future Foundation and key stakeholders within the City of Kansas City, efforts have resulted in the city becoming only the second in the nation to have adopted an ordinance that is designed to create career pathways specifically for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities.













## Opening of the Summit Social Center

In July of 2023, we opened the doors of our new social and recreational facility, affectionately named the Summit Social Center.

Our larger space is designed to foster an environment where those we support can mingle and socialize with friends while also learning new life and self help skills.



## Employer / Individual Spotlight: Parker (aka Mr. P) and Mimi's Pantry





Parker began participating in Watch
Me Thrive in the summer of 2020. As a
person who is non-speaking and requires
customized teaching approaches to
learn new skills, Watch Me Thrive allowed
Parker the opportunity to be engaged
in work-based learning experiences in

settings that both spoke to his strengths and met his learning needs. In the summer of 2023, after three years of volunteering at Mimi's Pantry, the executive director learned of Parker graduating from high school and his desire to pursue a paid employment position. Parker's onsite successes and growth in his skills resulted in a part-time job offer as an official Mimi's Pantry employee.

On having Parker join their team, Mimi's Pantry Executive Director Kelley Catterson shared, "I would highly recommend that employers consider hiring individuals with disabilities. If your company can provide an opportunity to give a person a purpose, it will not only benefit your company but can provide a lasting positive effect for the individual and the community. I see no disadvantage to becoming an inclusive employer."

Parker's journey demonstrates the power of our customized transition planning programs and the success of our business outreach efforts. Through these approaches, we are able to assist even those with the most significant disabilities in achieving their goals, and in living meaningful, inclusive lives.

#### **Individualized Supports**

Assists person served in increasing their personal independence in the home and in the community.

#### Watch Me Thrive - Transition Services

Our signature program is designed to help transitionaged youth and their families prepare for life after school based services. This program is designed to work with youth to develop the employment readiness skills needed to enter the workforce after graduation, while also supporting the family in creating an actionable transition plan. This program results in individuals and their families being better prepared for life after school based services.

#### Social and Recreational

Designed to meet the unique social and emotional needs of the individuals we serve and promote growth in interpersonal skills through participating in community based leisure activities.
